# Shining in Our Midst

Have you seen Jesus this week? Did you see evidence of God's presence in your day-to-day activities? Not sure? Look closer. Scripture says that God is found everywhere. The Gospel text for today tells of an "ordinary" dedication ceremony where two faithful servants, attuned to the Spirit of God, recognized something special, holy. These two people were Simeon, described by Luke as "righteous and devout," and Anna, a prophetess who "never left the temple but worshiped there with fasting and prayer night and day" (vv. 25, 37). Upon seeing Jesus in the temple, Simeon recognized him as the Messiah and proclaimed, "My eyes have seen your salvation, . . . a light . . . to the Gentiles" (vv. 30, 32). And Anna began to praise God and tell others about Jesus and the redemption he would bring.

We, too, can see this new light and revelation for the world. Jesus is in our midst today! Our bulletin cover image reminds me of a grove of trees near my home. I love looking up through the branches where the sun—like the light of God—shines down into the darkness below. God's presence is in us and all around us, even when we fail to recognize it. When we do experience God's light, it compels us to tell others, to share the good news. I am reminded of a brother at Annual Conference who compared our lives to a page with borders. We need to respect the borders, the spaces outside our comfort zone we enter to serve others and grow in Christ.


Our church includes testimonies of faithful servants from our past, such as Anna Mow and Dan West, as well as many living servants. I'm sure you can name some of them. They are examples to us, along with Simeon and Anna, in recognizing the light and love of Jesus. They also show us the need to be faithful by our encouragement of and service to others. Let us open our eyes to the Spirit moving in our midst. May we, like Simeon, say, "My eyes have seen your salvation." May we, like Anna, tell others about it, too.
