We hope you will join us for a rich discussion.

## THE IMPORTANCE OF MATTERING...

A church leader recently summed up the 10 commandments this way... *“Worship God and take care of each other.”* Together we can and should take care of each other – which I honestly believe becomes a way that we worship.

Jesus said we are to...*“Love one another as God loves us.”* Our responsibility then, as Jesus’ disciples, is to love God and our neighbor. These words, commands, and dreams should then give shape to the patterns of our behavior and character as disciples of Jesus.

April 6<sup>th</sup> was an interesting and particularly heavy day. On that day I heard about people – real people who are immigrants in our local community – who are afraid...afraid for so many reasons. Then that night, I got to hear the words of a mother whose gay son was murdered. I heard the news of bomb strikes in war torn and ravaged parts of the world. I was reminded of those I have known whose children and loved ones have died.

To all of you... *Thank you for your words, your story, and your resolve.* Your drive to get up and keep living each day is a witness to resolve... determination... and hope for goodness in the world.

To the priest who gave me a hug, straightened my shirt, and paid me a compliment... *Thank you!*

To the woman and child who, based solely on our appearances, likely have differences of religion, culture, power and privilege... *Thank you for entrusting me to give you a ride, and for the gentle way you wished for me God’s Blessings.*

The words I heard that day, the gentle gestures of care toward me, and the call of Jesus to love one another as good neighbors left me wanting to proclaim a message of PEACE! And yet in the depth of my soul what I really wanted to say to each person that day was: YOU matter! Your lives matter, each and every single one of you – each of us matters.

Whether or not you profess, or believe, or acknowledge a God or higher power, the God that I profess and proclaim each day and each week loves because we matter. By extension of that love, you matter to me, to my family, and to those in my family of faith. To those who are told by the world you don’t matter, I want you to know that there are individuals, institutions, communities, and yes there are churches where you do matter. For those...

*In the LGBT community,  
Who are refugees and immigrants,  
Whose skin color is used as a tool for judgement,  
Women who have been overlooked and diminished,  
Trapped in economic and spiritual poverties,  
Seen and unseen  
With addictions and whose mental health is at times debilitating or challenging,  
Seeking to find meaning and purpose and value,  
YOU matter. YOU ALL MATTER!*

During Lent, I tried to confess my complacency and my silence, for good news should not be kept silent. In this Eastertide it is time to proclaim peace. And in response to the news of resurrection, it is time to express of the value of human life – all life! In that spirit, for those...

Who find ways to build bridges and to be about the work of love and justice for ALL – *Thank you! You are courageous, and inspiring.*

Who, unlike me, do not carry the privileges of color, gender identification, or biology that the world recognizes as dominant – *Forgive me. Help me to see when and where I am blinded, so that together we may be about the work of proclaiming peace and love as we share in the joy of life abundant.*

As disciples of Jesus, may our eyes, hearts, and spirits be transformed. May the shadows of death, hatred, self-service, and the abuses of power and oppression for personal and corporate gain be overcome by the spark of light, glimmers of hope. May those of us who are currently carrying the light fan and feed it. And may those of us seeking for light be reminded and called by the smallest spark of hope in the darkness with the good news that...
