"SITTING IN THE GAP" - NOW OFFERING ONLINE SCRIPTURE STUDY GUIDES

Our new intergenerational Sunday School class, "Sitting in the Gap," is now up and running! Each week is a self-contained discussion for anyone interested in deeper exploration of and reflection on the scriptures and topics guiding our worship each Sunday. We follow a rabbinical model of spiritual formation — using the questions we bring to a scripture text to guide discussion, as we sit together and discuss how to interpret the scriptures and how to apply them to our lives. The class meets in the Gap Room (down the hall near the fish pond) and begins promptly at 9:45ish, with Pastor Chris providing facilitation and guidance. For those wishing to study or reflect on the scriptures ahead of time (or after the fact!), a weekly online study guide is now being offered on our website www.bwcob.org and follow the menus links from Faith Formation -> Sunday School -> Adult Classes -> Sitting in the Gap. Each study guide will link directly to the week's text(s), highlight a selected commentary, link to additional resources, and offer a few questions for reflection. Even if you aren't able to join the class for live discussion, it might be something worth checking out ...

PASTOR'S BOOK STUDY

Pastor Chris invites you to join him for continuing discussions on Wednesday afternoons, 2-3 pm, October 4 and October 18, on *The Book of Joy: Lasting Happiness in a Changing World* by The Dalai Lama and Archbishop Desmond Tutu with Douglas Abrams (2016). We will be discussing "Days 2 & 3" (through page 190) on the 4th and rest of the book on the 18th. You do not need to have read or purchased the book to participate (though it is, of course, very helpful!)

Looking Ahead – The next Pastor's Book Study will be November 1 and 15 and will focus on Days of Awe and Wonder: How to Be a Christian in the Twenty-First Century (2017) by the late scholar and theologian Marcus Borg. "Provocative and uplifting, this anthology illuminates Borg's explorations of the miraculous and wonderful, his understanding of conviction and fulfillment, and his contention that we must keep an open mind and question assumptions and certainties in all our religious journeys."
