Life and Love in Jesus

Our text for today has some good news for all of us. The author of 1 John wants us to know that in Jesus God has been fully revealed, but not as an angry, out-to-get-you-for-the-sin-in-your-life kind of God. Rather, God is exactly like Jesus—the light of the world, the one who guides us through darkness, and the advocate for what is good and merciful and loving.

This is the disposition we should adopt with one another. When we come together in a spirit of genuine concern and compassion, as a church and as neighbors, our joy is made complete. This is where the words of life—the words of Jesus—are revealed. And these are powerful words for modern Brethren. How can our joy be made complete when some are quick to see others as enemies for simply disagreeing with them? How is this life revealed in Jesus? I wonder what those outside our circles learn about life and love in Jesus through our actions? Do they see something loving, or hateful?


I find it extraordinary that 1 John 2:1-2 speaks of Christ as an advocate for those that miss the mark and go against the light. To have such a forgiving and merciful advocate like Jesus is good news indeed! Life is revealed in the pivotal moment on the cross, when the very light of the world asks God to forgive us all: those who think they have it all right, those who believe they have no sin, those who refuse to listen—everyone. Life is revealed when Jesus says, "Forgive them," and God responds, "Yes, that is what we'll do." This is life revealed. Let's work for that kind of love.

God Is Light
